The global number of child labourers has declined by one-third since 2000, but an estimated 168 Million Children are involved in child labour. Nearly Half (85 million) are doing hazardous work. 263 Million Children are out of school. The United Nations estimates that by the year 2020, half the world's illiterate population will live in India. It is important that we make a much greater contribution to prevent this dubious ranking for our country. Don Bosco Anbu Illam (DBAI) plays a lead role in 'Right to Education' of children, especially to rescue the working children and provide opportunity to children out-of-school due to socio-economic reasons.

Mahatma Gandhi always dreamt of an India where the poor would be given the opportunities they deserve as full citizens. The Bible repeatedly orders us to worship the one true God and Him alone; but simultaneously, it tells us that true religion is to care for the poor and needy. DBAI is a partner in this God-given Mission.
