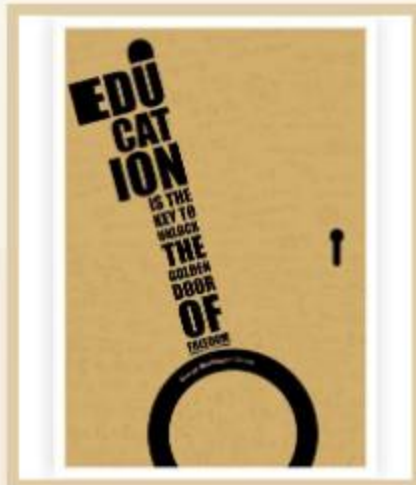
- **Spiritual Club** - To become good citizens

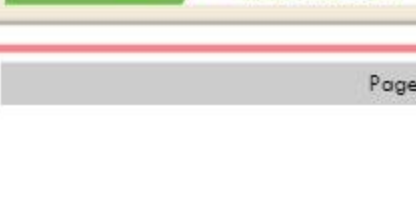
SEMINAR ON MOTIVATION & EDUCATION

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

SUMMER CAMP

“வெயிலோடு விளையாடி” is the name given for this year's summer camp. This camp mainly focused on developing child's intellectual ability and right based awareness. The camps were inaugurated by the children and community facilitators on 6th May 2019, Monday, being the first day of the camp it was Day of Introduction in which our NFEs and children were involved into self introduction and knowing each other. This session helped our children to know more about his/her companion and as well as our NFEs were also in a position to understand their people in depth.

This year the camp got three sessions as concrete in order to give continuous social education on Child Rights, POCSO Act and LSRW. The valediction of the summer camp held in the presence of Ms. Isabella, Member – Child Welfare Committee and Executive Director – Madras Christian Council of Social Service, Chennai whom in her presidential address touched upon Child Rights and Child Trafficking, an awareness movie titled 'Kadathal' was screened which projected the current situations for girl child. Rev.Fr.Joseph Leo welcomed the gathering followed by Rev.Fr.James Raj's celebration greetings. The program was presided over by Rev.Fr.Johnson Antonysami, Rector – Don Bosco Social Service Society, Rev.Fr.Paul Raj, Parish Priest – Mary, Help of Christian Church and Pr.J.Daniel – ACA Fellowship. Our children staged special numbers such as Mime on the theme of Save Waters, group dance, songs and awareness skit on the importance of education.



2ND ANNUAL STREET THEATER PERFORMANCES

Considering anti social elements and habit among children series of street theater was staged in major junctions between 27th May and 31st May 2019, covering a wide range of general public. Concepts such as media addiction, substance addiction and importance of school going were addressed. A team of 15 women with volunteers staged this program in four mass crowding areas. This caught the attention of bikers and passerby. We had the privilege of having inspectors of police from various stations for inaugurating these awareness shows which followed by awareness talk on the importance of school going by teachers from Park Town Mission Primary School,



TAMIL SEMMOZHI DHINAM

Tamil Semmozhi Dhinam was commemorated by the children and the women's group on 6th June 2019, it is an annual event that commemorates the declaration of Tamil as "The Classical Language" by the Indian Government. ICSC organized special events for children that kindled the usefulness of the language and the culture. A debate on the topic "தேய்கிறதா தமிழ் மொழி" (in English: Is Tamil language losing its prime place?) was organized for the women's group in Iyodhikuppam. Thought provoking points and arguments came up in the programme. This gave the platform for our people to exhibit their ideas and emotions.



CHILD LABOR ABOLITION DAY

A week long awareness programs were organized with regards to Anti Child Labour day. On 12th June our children played a game called Post Master through which they gave the awareness on anti child labour to all residence. Children went to each doorstep as post masters and gave post cards for awareness, even to the shopkeepers.



GENERAL MEDICAL CAMP

General medical camps were organized in association with KVT Multi Specialty Hospital in two phases. On 19th we served around 150 people from Kasimedu and on 21st June around 150 people from Vinayagapuram got benefitted. General medications were given and further directions were given to the people with prolonged sickness.



EXPOSURE VISIT

As per the programme of Children's parliament, around 70 of our children were taken to the Children's Road Safety and Traffic park on 22nd June. During this full day outing excellent insight and videos on road safety and a demo ride on the motor cycle were shown to the children. Mr. Aswin, the Event Guide gave the orientation on Road Safety. After meals, they were taken to Birla planetarium, where they were exposed to science's invention and role of science in everyday activities.



PROGRAMMES OF DBAI HCLF

MEDICAL CAMP

A free General & eye checkup camp for community people were organized on 1st May 2019 at Arumbakkam police boys & girls club in association with Apollo Hospital and An-Noor eye hospital. Around 233 of people have been benefitted through this free medical services. Majority of the people were diagnosed with diabetes and had been advised for further consultation and suggestions for the community people to maintain good health.



NIGHT VIGIL CAMP

Don Bosco Anbu Illam – HCLF conducted night vigil camp at Semmencherry Police Boys and Girls Club on 10th June 2019, Friday between 7pm and 1:30am in association with Cancer Institute, Chennai. First session was on Dealing with Peer Pressure, Mr. Ashok led this period through various thought provoking games and ice breaker sessions. Ms. Usha Rani from Cancer Institute handled a session on the ill effects of tobacco and dealt on the prevention and precaution measures. Mr. Sri Ram from HCL Foundation gave the awareness talk on alcoholism and the ill effects of drugs. Games like Blanket Throw Ball and Bucket Basket Ball were conducted to make the children more energetic and participative during the sessions. Mrs. Amutha, Mr. Anand and Ms. Ponmani from Don Bosco Anbu Illam gave awareness on Child Rights, conducted sessions on Rebirth celebration and Reproductive health. The day was successfully concluded with campfire.



EDUCATION EXPOSURE VISIT

DBAI HCLF organized two days of Education exposure visit to Rameshwaram for Children from all Clubs. On the first day they had a visit to Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam's home. There the club children had orientation about the history of Abdul kalam. The whole life journey of his highness A.P.J Abdul kalam was really an inspiration. Next they had a visit to Abdul kalam's memorial and Dhanushkodi beach point. Their journey extended to the second day and had a visit to Vivekananda Memorial, Pamban Bridge & Marine national park. Children were given exposure on the architectural construction of the Pamban bridge and they learnt the uses of floating stone to construct ancient bridge connecting Dhanushkodi to Talimannar. There was a good Coordination between the children and the staff. The children enjoyed the educational visit and they have observed & learnt a lot to build up their level of knowledge.



DBAI HCLF VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER

Valedictory function was organized by DBAI HCLF VTC on June 19th 2019 for students of 2nd & 3rd batch who completed the Tally & ITES courses. A total of 100 students were certified by the HRD & DBAI. The Chief Guest for the program was Mrs. Simi Suri, AGM of HCLF, and Mr. Ashok Kumar Deputy Commissioner of Police, T.Nagar, Rev. Fr. Josph Leo Director of DBAI, Mr. Tholkapiyan Asst. Commissioner of Police T.Nagar, Rev. Fr. James Raj Administrator of DBAI and Mr. Newton Raj, AM of HCLF.



TOBACCO AWARENESS

DBAI HCLF Organized an awareness on World No Tobacco Day at Kannagi Nagar Police Boys and Girls Club. The Chief Guests for the awareness programme were Fr. James Sdb, Mr. Balamurali Inspector of Kannagi Nagar, and Mr. Sri Ram HCL. The rally began after the waving of the flag by Mr. Balamurali. The rally headed for about 2 Kms. The children distributed the pamphlets to the people, who came to know more about the Ill Effects of Tobacco. The Inspector gave awareness on the ill effects of Tobacco and other substance abuses. The Police officers who participated in the rally too spoke to the children and people and appreciated for the efforts taken to conduct the awareness programme. DBAI HCLF finally thanked all the children, Police officers, Volunteers and the community gathered for the Support and finally distributed the refreshments to all the participants.

CHILD RIGHTS CLUB FORMATION

DBAI HCLF Organized the Child Rights Club Reformation for the Month of June at Arumbakkam Police Boys & Girls Children's Club. CRC orientation was given by Mr. Jayaprakash from DBAI who spoke on the roles and responsibilities of a leader in respective right clubs. The talk was about Patron Ship of rights and its procedure in exercising it, Ice Breakers for self-introduction etc. Finally The Session Ended With Evaluation.



CAREER GUIDANCE

DBAI HCLF Children's Club organized a Counseling Service for Board Exam Students, in which Prof. Moses from Madras School of Social Work - the Resource Person handled the Session through Video Presentation and thought provoking messages. He also conducted SWOT analysis, which helped the Participants to know their positives individually. The Students were asked to Share their carrier plan. Many shared their future career and some were not able to say what they are about to do in their future. So the Counselor gave detailed information about the courses that are available to study and how it would help them to choose their goal in the future. The Carrier Guidance Counselor gave hints of How to expand their Network.



WORLD ENVIRONMENTAL DAY

World environmental day was celebrated with full enthusiasm at Kodambakkam and Arumbakkam. It was organized by DBAI HCLF Police boys & girls club. Children participated in plantation drive to make their surrounding green. Saplings were implanted by the scout children at Kodambakkam and a short film was shown for children to create awareness on solid wastage management. Reshma of the 10th STD from Arumbakkam, presented a thought provoking speech on environment pollution, followed by Mr. PRAKASH (Tuition teacher) who shared about the history and importance of environment day.



MEDICAL CAMP

DBAI HCLF organized a free general & eye checkup camp on the 8th of June 2019 at Thiruvortiyur police boys & girls club. The health checkup started at 10.00 am & it ended by 1.30 p.m. Around 116 people availed the free medical facilities indiscriminately provided by the medical center. In this medical camp Bp, Sugar checkups were also paid special attention. Main complaints among the adults were related to diabetes. Doctors advised them various medicines and consultation during the camp and doctor gave some suggestion and tips to the community people of how to maintain their health. The camp was organized successfully in collaboration with the team from Apollo hospital.



WORLD CHILD LABOR DAY

The World Child Labor's Day awareness rally was prepared by the children of Arumbakkam on June 14, 2019. It was organized by **DBAI HCLF police boys & girls children's club**. The Chief Guest of the programme was Mrs. Renuga devi (inspector of police) from K8 Arumbakkam police station. She had an interaction with the children to motivate them. The children went on a rally to create awareness about the day and they were carrying placards and raising slogans against the social evil of child labour, the harmful effects of child labour, the necessity of sending a child to school and the importance of education. More than 120 children participated in the rally.

DBAI HCLF Children's Club organized an International Yoga Day. It Was Celebrated by The Club Children With Great Enthusiasm. Children did Various Asana animated By Ms.Sumitha (Yoga Instructor). He also conducted rebirth celebration for the children. **Ms Jayalakshmi** from Cancer institute conducted a session on Substance abuse and the aftermath. **Mr. Anand** conducted sessions on child rights and awareness on child line 1098. Around 70 beneficiaries participated including children and community people and all NGO partners participated. Children performed skits and dances during camp fire. The overall night vigil camp was very useful with essential sessions and was successful.



STAFF CAPACITY

DBAI HCLF MYC organized Staff capacity building for the tuition teachers and Mobilizer. MR. BABU was the resource person for the day. He explained on how to handle the children and how to address their issues especially the adolescents. He also explained about the characteristics of migrant children and how to organize programs and services for migrant children. SPORTS' RULES & REGULATIONS

The Childline team organized three days of programmes and celebrated World Day against Child Labour at three different areas. The team conveyed the message on Child labour through Street Theater and Group Song.

On 13th June the team went to Government Higher Secondary School, Pudhumanaikuppam, and on the 14th June to Government Higher secondary School at Vinayagapuram to animate about Childline and Child Labour day, where 200 children participated. The team had an interaction session with the children. The children actively participated. The team performed Street Theater and Group song.

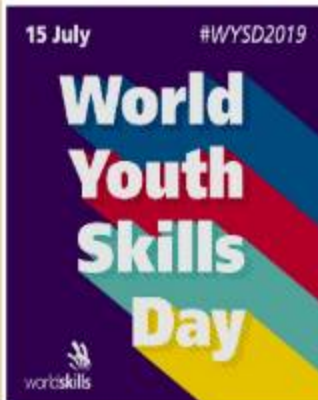
