

Awareness programs

On behalf of the management, intense measures are exercised in order to spread the importance of Covid prevention mechanisms. Women Self Help Groups are equipped to watch over their respective community and share knowledge then and there. An awareness pamphlet that contains virus prevention guidelines were distributed to the people at their door steps.



Making gadgets meaningful



In order to engage children during lockdown, a team of designated staff working irrespective of projects in conducting interesting online programs such as quiz competition, art contests, life skill sessions etc. our children participate in large numbers and make their time effective.



SOP Compilation and Release



In view of raising issues concerning online education, the management decided to formulate policy combined rules and regulations for its online ac-



tivities. In context to this, a team of staff representing various strata of DBAI, children representative from Saranalayam along with a field expert participated in the preliminary discussion on 9th June 2021. Insights from different angles poured out. This then followed by literature build-

ing and fine tuning of the SOP. On the 24th June 2021, DBAI published its own Standard Operating Procedure.

Effects of Lockdown



Webinar on the effect of lockdown among women flock was organized by Niraivagam on 12th June 2021. A total of 55 women representing different self-help groups participated in this program. Dr. J. Vasantha Kumari, Mentor and Managing Trustee of INCAD Foundation animated the audience on the ill effects of lockdown idleness, miscommunication among family members, relationship failure and parenting skills. She then also highlighted the importance being open to others' views and suggestions. She taught about family values.

GOAL Program - 2021

A 17 days intense program on Life Skills for adolescents' girls was organized between 2nd and 21st June 2021. A team of life skill teachers from Thozhamai Foundation animated our children. 20 girls representing each slum intervention participated and successfully completed the course. The course module is designed in such a way



that incorporated social, moral, physical, psychological and emotional wellbeing. Animators taught about personal hygiene, causes and precaution of HIV Aids, team work, conflict management, peer pressure and sex education.

Online Medical Consultation

In order to bring about awareness among young mothers and youngsters on 26th June 2021 we organized online consultation on Covid19. Dr. Suriyaraj from KVT Multi Specialty Hospital, Errukkencherry consented to share knowledge. The consultation lasted for two hours by including experience talk, treatment prescription and live question and answer session. 150 people from different intervention areas participated. Children need to learn how to protect their environment, be kind to each other, and make decisions that benefit the world as a whole. It is very important to spread awareness about environmental issues like deforestation, increasing global warming, wastage and losses of food, pollution. This Environment Festival stimulated every individual to think

about newer ways to reduce the consumption of natural resources, develop greener models, and become sustainable. Through these competitions and informative sessions, healthy environment habits are inculcated in the young minds.

The Police Boys and Girls Club beneficiaries have pledged to plant nearly 20,000 saplings within this year. Sessions with seniors leaders and stakeholders have inspired children to live in harmony with nature, and for them to become valiant protectors of a green future.

The Environment Festival has relatively increased the questioning, investigating, defining problems, analyzing, interpreting, reasoning, developing conclusions, and problem-solving skills of the children. The models/artwork created by the children proves that this Environment Festival was an engaging platform for gaining and applying knowledge and skills in science, technology, and the environment.

Readers' Program in June 2021

Don Bosco Anbu Illam - HCL Foundation organized a 19 days Readers Program through virtual. This event was conducted all weekdays except weekends.



Through this session, we were given various knowledge about Environment, Agriculture, Indian culture & Tradition, State & Central Government Organizational Structure, Indian Currency, and Architectural Wonders of India are taught by the students. Throughout this session, Children are actively participated and enjoyed. This program has served around 30,000 women, 25,000 children, 27,000 men, 18,000 youngsters.

This unconditional and daring program has brought laurel to the organization (DBAI) and also served to build a strong network with government bodies. The Greater Chennai Corporation has awarded *Certificate of Appreciation* for our support in addressing the health emergency.

He was admitted back in bosco illam. The boy wanted to go back to his family. We found that his mother is at Karnataka and we came to know that his father Mohana rana and his Mother piyasi rana is not living together because his father use to steal for alcohol so he left his wife long back. Piyasi rana mar-

ried mohana rana brother now she has two more children. They are living together in Anjees farm, Karnataka. They are willing to take care of Rakesh Mahata and he also willing to live with his mother so with the help of CWC North zone we got a transfer order for the boy to Karnataka. Due to high covid cases in Karnataka we waited after the relaxation of lock down in Karnataka with the help of Mr. Vignesh we sent the boy to Karnataka and produced the boy in front of chikkabalapura cwc on 29.06.2021. He was handed over to his mother in front of CWC chikkabalapura. The boy was happy to go back with his mother.

Support of CAKE SQUARE - Guindy


