Bosco Anbu Illam Chennai. The ChildLine Team provides Emotional Support for the boy and his family.


#### INTENSE COUNSELING PROGRAM

The counselor has been interacting with all the children who are studying from 9<sup>th</sup> std till 12<sup>th</sup> std. Individual and group counseling is done and therapies like CBT (Cognitive Behavior Therapy), REBT (Rational Emotive Behavioral Therapy), Talk therapy, SFBT (Solution Focused Brief Therapy) are given. Individual Care Plan is done regularly to know about the children improvement in Physical, Mental and Social level.

The children who have completed 10<sup>th</sup> std were given options to chose group for higher education. They have chosen group according to their interest. As part of summer camp the counselor took life skill sessions for the children on 20<sup>th</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup> of April'21.

On 20<sup>th</sup> the session was about "Team Work". PPT presentation had details about Leadership and group members. The session started with a game about team work. A video was played about bad and good team work which helped the children to understand about team work, Do's and Don'ts were also explained to build the team strong. The session was very interactive as they were made to answer questions about the topic. As a team the Leaders/Captains were able to identify the dynamics of their team.

On 22<sup>nd</sup> "How to handle failures" was the topic which started with a group discussion of how they handled a failure in their personal life which lead them to success. After discussion the children were informed to share the same with the whole group. The session had a video presentation about Abraham Lincoln's and Derek (Olympic athlete) life history and how he became successful in life. The children also learnt about how a successful person leads his/her life, and their habits.
