Don Bosco Anbu Illam operates multiple shelter homes dedicated to providing care and protection for children. Our organization extends its reach through various community centers, offering support and intervention to children in underserved areas. Through these initiatives, we aim to create a positive impact and foster a safe environment for children in need.

## VISIT FOR GUIDANCE

On 3rd of January 2025, Fr. Joe Prabhu, Director, National YaR Forum and Mrs Jyothi Priya, Hub Coordinator, INM Province visited Saranalayam to oversee the ongoing activities and assessed the operational efficiency. They provided strategic inputs for improved functioning. The visit also included discussions regarding the Node Status and implementation of Home-Link DIGI. During the visit, the Hub Coordinator conducted a thorough review of all registers maintained at Saranalayam. The focus was on ensuring proper documentation, accuracy in record-keeping.



## RECREATIONAL ACTIVITY - DRAWING

On 11th of January 2025, a recreational drawing session was conducted for the children to encourage creativity, self-expression, and enjoyment. The session began with an introduction to different drawing techniques, followed by an open-ended creative session where children were encouraged to sketch and colour based on their imagination. They expressed their thoughts and emotions through their artwork, drawing various subjects such as: Cartoons, Flowers and others. The outcome of the activity included fostered imaginative thinking and artistic skills. Presenting their artwork boosted their self-esteem and confidence.



## SKILL DEVELOPMENT SESSION FOR CHILDREN

On 12th of January 2025, a skill development session was conducted by Ms. Deepshi Reyan, Child Welfare Officer, aimed at enhancing the children's essential life skills. The session focused on imparting time management skills, encouraging daily reading and writing habits to 8 to 11 years old children. She explained how effective planning and prioritization can help children balance their studies, playtime and other activities efficiently.



She recommended techniques such as using timetable, setting small goals and minimizing distractions to discipline the routines. To instill a habit of continuous learning, she encouraged children to read books, newspapers and short stories, and to maintain a daily journal or diary. She explained how reading broadens knowledge and writing enhances creativity and expression. To make the session more interactive and enjoyable, ice-breaking activities were conducted.

## JOYFUL COOKING: A BACKYARD CULINARY EXPERIENCE

On 18th of January 2025, "The Joyful Cooking: A Backyard Culinary Experience" was a delightful and engaging event where children actively participated in preparing a delicious meal – Biryani. This experience not only nurtured their culinary skills but also fostered teamwork, discipline and joy. The backyard setting created a warm and traditional atmosphere, making the activity even more memorable. Each child took on different responsibilities such as chopping vegetables, cleaning the meat, helping in preparation and ensuring an organized and collaborative cooking experience.

## MENTORING VISIT

On 23rd of January 2025, the mentoring visit by Miracle Foundation was conducted to assess the activities and challenges in the reintegration and adoption process. The visit involved interactive sessions with staff, a review of Individual Care Plans (ICP), discussions on specific child cases and a life skills training session for the staff.



## POSTAL LEARNING

As part of the Skill Development Program organized by, We Live Foundation, a group of children aged 15 to 17 visited the Anna Nagar Post Office. The Post Man provided valuable insights on various postal services, including savings schemes, types of post and their purposes, procedure involved in sending the post and form filling formats. It is evident that the visit provided an educational experience as well as practical knowledge to children.



## PARENTS' MEETING

Every Month's second Sunday, DBAI holds parents' meeting in both Bosco Illam and Saranalayam. Likewise, on 09<sup>th</sup> February 2025, 20 parents visited the CCI to meet their Children. The meeting ensured meaningful interaction and awareness among parents, children, and CCI Staff. It served as a valuable platform to strengthen the bond between parents and the institution, ensuring better cooperation for the well-being of the children.



## NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY CELEBRATION

On 26th of January 2025, National Girl Child Day (Every year falls on 24<sup>th</sup> January) was celebrated with enthusiasm and purpose through a sensitization program focused on Responsible Sexual Behavior. The focus group was 13 to 17 years old girl children. Ms. Harrsida, the Counselor, led the session and sensitized the participants on various crucial topics, including: Disparity between Love and Infatuation, Process of Menstrual Cycle, Safe and Unsafe Touch and Consequences of Teenage Pregnancy. To ensure active participation and engagement, ice-breaking games were conducted throughout the session. A short film titled 'Maa' was screened for the children, reinforcing the themes discussed in the session through a visual and emotional narrative. At the end of the session, all participants provided handwritten feedback, sharing their learnings and reflections.



## TRANSITION CARE

The Staff Capacity Program on Transition to Aftercare was organized by We Live Foundation on February 7, 2025, in which 7 staff from DBAI has taken part to get the insights into effectively preparing youth for their transition from Child Care Institutions (CCIs) to independent living.

The Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation (TNSDC) organized a program focusing on skill development for all the CCI children. Our children from Bosco Illam and Saranalayam between the age of 14 to 18 years old attended the program which highlighted the TN government initiatives for empowering the youth through various skill development programs. During the program, the children received the guidance for different career pathways.
