On 7th April World Health Day was celebrated. The chief guest Ms. Priscilla spoke about the importance of health, signs and symptoms which should be reported immediately which will help them for a better tomorrow. The children show cased their gratitude through a dance performance.





MEDICAL CAMP

On 24th April, a general medical camp was conducted by Kauvery Hospital for 37 children. The children discussed about their health to the consultant and clarified their doubts. Medications were prescribed to the required children according to their needs.

OUR EARTH OUR FUTURE

World Earth Day was celebrated on April 22nd. Ms. Swathe gave awareness to children about damage to earth due to plastic as it doesn't decompose. She also explained its effect on animals and trees and much more. The session helped the children to learn more about plantation and increased their interest in gardening.



INTERVENTIONS

Childline team had received a total of around 203 calls during the month of March and April 2022, the team had intervened for nearly 91 cases, 54 children had been produced before CWC for care and protection of the children, the needs of the other cases were fulfilled by the team and the allied department through the help of Childline. The team found 37 cases which were based on sexual abuse, and 5 child marriage cases and those cases were filed for FIR Child marriage 2006 and POCSO Act 2012,





AWARENESS FOR SPORTERS

The team participated in a community program on 8th March 2022 at Besant Nagar which was organised by sport association with the support of district commissioner. Team sensitized regarding child sexual abuse and child marriage among the sports students (Girls). Around 65 children were the beneficiaries of the program. The team also promoted Child Helpline Number (1098).

MAKING YOUNG MINDS IGNITED

On 24th March 22, the team conducted a sensitization program at Thiruvottiur Kaladipet, the team organized the program in a public library with the support of Anbu Illam. There were discussions about Child Labour and Child Marriage among college students and adolescent. Around 45 students had participated in this program.





CHILD RIGHTS AT CHILDHOOD

On 26th of March the Childline team conducted a school awareness program for 6th to 9th std students from a government school in Gopalapuram, Chennai. The program was regarding cases of child substance abuse and ChildLine general awareness. Around 400 children were the beneficiaries of the program.

GETTING TRAINED IN ADVANCE

30th of March the team participated in a training program which was organized by Childline India foundation in Periyamed Chennai. The topic of the program was "How to Deal with the children who need care and protection". The team was trained to give a short term counselling and identify the children's emotional and physical needs. The Resource person was Mr. Kumara Babu (Founder & Director of Banian foundation). It was a useful training for all team members and Coordinators.





SOCIAL WORKERS ARE THE SOCIAL CHANGE MAKERS

The team conducted a Sensitization program for MSW Social work Students regarding Childline services and the program which was held in Royapuram Don Bosco Shelter. The team received the required support from the students.

TEAM EMPOWERED ON CHILD RIGHTS

The team organized a program for college students at Thiruthangal Nadar College of Arts & Science in Mulakadai Kodungauir, and sensitized about Childline activities and what are the difficulties faced by the children who are living on the streets, and by abandoned children. The team also discussed about what are the activities of Childline in collaboration with Don Bosco Anbu Illam. Nearly 150 Students had participated for the program.


VOICE OF VOLUNTEERS - 2022
